The first purpose of my life is to be loved by God

“Long ago, even before he made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy and without fault in his eyes.” Eph. 1:4 (NLT)

My first calling is to enjoy a relationship with God

“Dear friends in Rome, God loves you dearly, and he has called you to be his very own people.” Rom. 1:7 (NLT)

The relationship is to be his son or his daughter

“What an incredible quality of love the Father has shown to us, that we should be named and called and counted the children of God! And so we are!” 1 John 3:1 (Amp)

WHAT TAKES PLACE IF I STAY AWARE OF GOD'S CONSTANT LOVE FOR ME?

1. I feel accepted rather than ashamed

“By faith we have been made acceptable to God. And now, because of our Lord Jesus Christ, we live at peace with God.” Rom. 5:1 (CEV)

“If God says his chosen ones are acceptable to him, can anyone bring charges against them? Or can anyone condemn them? No indeed!” Rom. 8:33-34 (CEV)

2. I am bold in bringing my needs to God

“All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God! So, you should not be like cowering, fearful slaves. You should behave instead like God's very own children, adopted into his family—calling him ‘Father, dear Father.’ ... And since we are his children, we will share his treasures—for everything God gives to his Son, Christ, is ours, too.” Rom. 8:14-15, 17 (NLT)

“Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.” Heb. 4:16 (NIV)

3. I gain the courage to take risks
