Reasons To Be GRATEFUL

1. God's love

"See how very much our heavenly Father loves us, for he allows us to be called his children—think of it—and we really are!" 1 John 3:1

"God's loyal love couldn't have run out, his merciful love couldn't have dried up. They're created new every morning. How great your faithfulness!" Lam. 3:22-23 (Mes)

2. God's forgiveness

"When you were stuck in your old sin-dead life, you were incapable of responding to God. God brought you alive—right along with Christ! Think of it! All sins forgiven, the slate wiped clean, that old arrest warrant canceled and nailed to Christ's Cross." Col. 2:13-14 (Mes)

3. God never gives up on me

4. God's grace which is sufficient for my every need
